Coordinators for European Youth Camps

1. House of Europe

House of Europe is an EU*¹-funded programme fostering professional and creative exchange between Ukrainians and their colleagues in EU* countries. The programme focuses on different professional fields: culture and creative industries, education, health, social entrepreneurship, media, and youth.

This encompasses 20+ separate programme lines enabling to go for professional events, internships, and networking in the EU*, or to enrol in study tours, residencies, trainings, and other forms of support. House of Europe funds cultural coproductions and cooperations between Ukrainian and EU* organisations, along with the development of cultural infrastructure and artistic concepts for youth in Ukraine. Finally, the programme offers various youth camps and an intra-Ukrainian university exchange.

Implementation of House of Europe is led by Goethe-Institut Ukraine, with The British Council, Institut français, and Czech Centres as consortium partners.

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2. What is this call about?

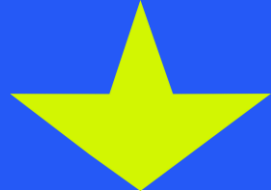
We are looking for partners to coordinate the implementation of a pedagogical programme and the work of animators during the European Youth Camps. The target audience of the camps are children aged 11-16 years from all over Ukraine.

3. What are European Youth Camps?

European Youth Camps are summer camps with a focus on values important to European and Ukrainian society. We choose an important topic for each session and explain it to children in an interactive way. Among these topics are ecology, sustainable development, health, tolerance, inclusion, democracy, and innovation. Children learn, make friends and have fun.

The participants also have access to a specially designed mobile application with additional information, quests, and games. The application operates on iOS and Android.

In 2021, the selected topics of the camps are “Tolerance and inclusion” and “Ecology and sustainable development”. Other thematics will be developed in 2022.

4. What are the formats of the European Youth Camps?

European Youth Camps might be developed in up to three different formats:

- Offline European Youth Camps within leisure or health camps structures that last for 14 days
- Nomad European Youth Camps within the premises of educational organisations or school institutions that last for 5 days
- Online European Youth Camps on an online educational platform that last for 10 days

Online format is considered an alternative in case of sanitary restrictions linked to the COVID-19 pandemic. The submission of a budget is still required.

5. What is the timeline of the European Youth Camps?

We plan to carry out:

- Two nomad camps during the autumn school vacations in 2021
- Two nomad camps during the spring school vacations in 2022
- Four offline camps in summer 2022

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6. What is the location of the European Youth Camps?

The location of the nomad and offline European Youth Camps will be known later. You should be able to operate in all regions of Ukraine.

7. What are the partner's tasks?

Offline European Youth Camps

- Selection of the animators
- Implementation of the pedagogical and administrative coordination of the camps, including the organisation of pedagogical and leisure activities, a daily monitoring of the activities and the management of the involved staff (animators, European volunteers and thematic experts)
- Work in coordination with the selected service providers for the development of a mobile application and methodologies to implement them during the camp
- Organisation of an online or offline training on the necessary pedagogical content and digital tools for the staff involved

Nomad European Youth Camps

- Selection of the animators
- Implementation of the pedagogical and administrative coordination of the camps, including the organisation of pedagogical and leisure activities, a daily monitoring of the activities and the management of the involved staff (animators, European volunteers and thematic experts).



- Work in coordination with the selected service providers for the development of a mobile application and methodologies to implement them during the camp
- Organisation of the transportation and accommodation of the staff involved in the selected regions
- Organisation of the catering for all participants to the camp: one meal a day and snacks
- Organisation of an online or offline training on the necessary pedagogical content and digital tools for the staff involved

Online European Youth Camp

- Selection of the animators
- Implementation of the pedagogical and administrative coordination, including the provision of pedagogical content on dedicated educational platforms, daily monitoring of activities and management of staff involved
- Work in coordination with the selected service providers for the development of a mobile application, methodologies and digital educational platforms to implement them during the camp
- Organisation of an online training on the necessary pedagogical content and digital tools for the staff involved

8. What is not included in the partner's tasks?

- Selection of the hosting structures: leisure camps, health camps, or educational institutions
- Development of the pedagogical and linguistic programmes
- Selection of the participants of the European Youth Camps
- Selection of the pedagogical online platform for online camps
- Selection of the service providers for methodological programmes and pedagogical tools

9. Who can apply?

- Private organisations
- Private entrepreneurs
- NGOs

10. Who cannot apply?

- Political parties
- Religious organisations

11. What do you need to apply?

- Experience in both logistics and educational pedagogical programme implementation
- Ability to operate in all regions of Ukraine
- Ability to operate in different locations simultaneously
- Ability to be contracted through a service provision convention



- Interest in tolerance and inclusion and ecology and sustainable development

12. How do I apply?

Please submit your application along with all the documents via the [online platform](#). Chapter “European Youth Camps”, open call – “Coordination for European Youth Camps “Let’s meet Europe!”.

The deadline is **Monday 27 September 2021, 15:00 Kyiv time**.

13. What additional documents do I need to provide?

- CV of the person(s) who will be responsible for the coordination
- Scanned copy of the extract from the Unified State Register or status documents
- Budget drafted in [our template](#)
- Recommendations (if available)

14. How will the partner be selected?

- 4 First, all the applications will be checked whether they meet technical criteria and if all the listed information and all the demanded certificates are given.

If your application is compliant, we will evaluate it according to the selection criteria: price quote and relevant experience.

15. How will the partnership be regulated?

All services will be contracted through a service providing convention.
