We are looking for an experienced full-time manager to lead the Hub department from September 2021 until March 2023.

Hub is the department behind the House of Europe <u>website</u> with the <u>catalogue of opportunities</u> and the <u>knowledge library</u>. The department whose Officers curate regional programmes touring Ukrainian cities (<u>Popup Hub</u>, the <u>House of Europe Festival</u>, and the <u>Mobile Pavilion</u>) and launch boot camps for creative start-ups <u>Creative Business Academy</u>. It powers the info desk in Kyiv, where people can get answers to their questions, and manages an <u>Alumni Community</u>.

House of Europe is a EU-funded programme fostering professional and creative exchange between Ukrainians and their colleagues in EU*1 countries. The programme focuses on culture and creative industries, education, health, social entrepreneurship, media, and youth.

This encompasses 20+ separate programme lines enabling us to go for conferences, professional events, internships, and networking in the EU*, or to enrol in study tours, residencies, training, and other forms of support. House of Europe funds cultural coproductions and cooperations between Ukrainian and EU* organisations, along with the development of cultural infrastructure and artistic concepts for youth in Ukraine. Finally, the programme offers various youth camps and an intra-Ukrainian university exchange.

What you will be doing

- Managing the Hub department: <u>Online Hub</u>, <u>Pop-up Hub</u>, <u>House of Europe Festival</u>, <u>Creative Business Academy</u>, <u>Creative Business Cup</u>, <u>Mobile Pavilion</u>, <u>Alumni Community</u>, and the info-desk at the House of Europe Kyiv-office
- Leading the team of five people: three Officers, one Coordinator, and one Assistant
- Closely cooperating with the Editor and the Communications team
- Reporting to the Head of Programme
- Delivering financial, narrative, and statistical reporting in close cooperation with the Head of Programme, Head of Finance, and Monitoring & Evaluation Officer
- Managing workflows with other departments, in particular Communication, Monitoring & Evaluation, Finance and Administration
- Managing and controlling operational finances of the Hub department: weekly, monthly, and overall financial planning, liquidity management, and timeliness of payments
- Ensuring compliance with administrative rules and procedures of the Goethe-Institut and the EU: tenders and procurements, documentation of spendings
- Ensuring programme activities meet expectations, and are delivered on time and to budget
- Reaching out to and collaborating with partners, experts, professional networks, and organisations from Ukraine and the EU
- Contributing to the visibility of the House of Europe programme in Ukraine and the EU

What skills and qualifications do you need

- English and Ukrainian at C1 level
- University degree
- Experience of leading a team
- At least two years' experience of project delivery

















- At least two years' experience of working in a donor-funded programme
- Experience in an international, English-speaking environment
- Strong leadership skills and ability to react to problems in teams
- Self-reflection and acceptance of criticism
- Structured and result-oriented approach, ability to get things done
- Availability to work under stress, with temporarily high workload, and under minimal supervision
- Readiness to travel for business, work on weekends and in the evenings when needed
