We are looking for a Ukrainian or international professional to hold an independent final evaluation of the House of Europe programme and provide the recommendations on its prolongation.

Read the document carefully, and make sure to apply <mark>before Monday 31</mark> October 2022, 15.00 Kyiv time.

House of Europe

House of Europe is a EU-funded programme fostering professional and creative exchange between Ukrainians and their colleagues in EU^{*1} countries. The programme focuses on culture and creative industries, education, health, social entrepreneurship, media, and youth.

This encompasses 20+ separate programme lines enabling us to go for conferences, professional events, internships, and networking in the EU*, or to enroll in study tours, residencies, training, and other forms of support. House of Europe funds cultural coproductions and cooperations between Ukrainian and EU* organisations, along with the development of cultural infrastructure and artistic concepts for youth in Ukraine. Finally, the programme offers various youth camps and an intra-Ukrainian university exchange. Following Russia's all-out war against Ukraine, a substantial War Response package was deployed.

What you will be doing

Conducting an independent final evaluation of the EU-funded programme House of Europe and composing action-specific recommendations on the design of House of Europe 2.0.

What skills and qualifications do you need

- English at C1 level
- Bachelor degree
- At least two years' experience in conducting evaluations of projects, in particular in an international context
- Experience in International Technical Assistance projects and other forms of EU support, in particular in Ukrainian, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, or the Republic of Moldova
- Experience of conducting evaluation that includes engagement with Ukrainian NGOs and governmental institutions
- Experience in evaluating projects in crisis regions, countries at war, or when projects are affected by unforeseen events
- Knowledge of DAC evaluation standards and EU evaluation criteria
- Knowledge of qualitative research methods
- Knowledge of empirical social research and data analysis methodologies
- Knowledge of cost-performance, cost-benefit, and costeffectiveness analyses
- Writing skills: the ability to display the analysis in a technically and narratively sound, legible, and targeted manner in a report
- Intercultural sensitivity
- Communicative competence and sociability
- Ability to work in a team
- Resilience and ability to get things done in a short time

- A list of previous evaluations. Please include at least three relevant cases with short descriptions.






