

Frequently Asked Questions

Digital cooperation grants

1. What legal entities can apply for the grant?

Legal entities with the right to accept charitable donations can apply. These include city councils and communal enterprises in the first place.

2. Can universities apply?

Yes, universities are welcome to apply if they have a suitable idea – a digital project in the sphere of culture.

3. Does my partnering organisation need to submit a separate application?

No, you submit one joint application. To this end, you must decide which organisation will assume major responsibility for the realisation of the project and reporting. You should apply on behalf of the organisation.

You should provide the registration documents of the partnering organisation and a signed memorandum.

4. Does my partnering organisation have to be a registered legal entity?

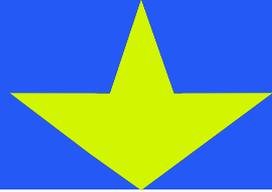
Yes, the partnering organisation should be registered as a legal entity in its country of origin.

5. Can my partner be a for-profit organisation?

Yes. We made an exception for the digital cooperation grants and allowed collaborations with for-profit organisations. However, a for-profit organisation can only be a partner, not an applying organisation.

6. How are finances managed between the partners?

We will transfer the money to the applying organisation. Afterwards, the payments and transfers are up to you. You can transfer some money to the account of the partnering organisation or pay via the account of the applying organisation.



7. Which partner is responsible for the payments of the taxes?

The applying partner is responsible for reporting and paying the taxes.

8. Can my partnering organisation submit another project on its behalf?

No, a partnering organisation cannot submit another project with other organisation.

9. Can you help me to find a partnering organisation?

No, unfortunately, we cannot find a partnering organisation for you.

10. Will you announce the winners publicly?

Yes. When we sign the contracts with the winners, we will announce them on social media. We will also tell a little bit more about the projects of the winners. This will take place no earlier than **in June 2020**.

11. How many projects can I submit in one call?

The number of projects from one organisation is not limited. However, we advise concentrating on the one you are most excited about. This way, you can make it impeccable and impress the experts.

12. Can organisations from the UK apply?

Yes. Organisations from the UK can apply for the grant despite Brexit. However, this may change in the future.
